


Eco Competition—Award Ceremony

Since January this year, the Eco-Warriors have been working tirelessly to come up with ways to save energy in our school. They entered a competition run by a Surrey based STEM charity called SATRO. At the start of the year, a fancy smart meter was installed at our school and the Eco-Warriors were 'coached' in how to read the data and monitor the usage. After class discussions, many assembly notices and gentle reminders to teachers, we started to see our numbers dropping! On Wednesday 6<sup>th</sup> July, Mrs Sawyer, Miss Coleman and some of the Eco-Warriors attended an awards ceremony at



Surrey University. And they managed to scoop not one - but **TWO** of the prestigious awards! Including the one that every school wanted: The school that saved the most carbon emissions. The aim was to cut our emissions by 10%. However, Godalming Junior School smashed this target and saved a whopping 34.29%! In total, the 11 schools saved an enormous 10.5 tonnes of carbon emissions over a 4-month period. Next year, the Eco-Warriors hope to refine their strategies further and send home some advice on how you too can lower your energy emis-
