Attendance Once again, we continue to enjoy high levels of attendance (97%) and very low levels of persistent absence (5%). Thank you to all the families who continue to keep school attendance an area of strength at GJS. We would like to take this time to remind families that ALL gates are closed at 8.35am, as this is the time children should be in class as registers are being taken at this time.

As we move into the summer term children may choose to wear their smart summer uniform. You can find the school uniform policy <u>here</u>. Please note that though winter uniform is still an option, the children are required to wear a tie IF they are wearing the 'winter' shirt. Please can you inform the school office or your child's teacher if for any reason you are experiencing any uniform issues and ensure all uniform is named. Please also note that children must be dressed in full winter uniform on 5th June when their class photographs will be taken. Second-hand summer dresses will be available in the office for the first week back, priced at £3 (card payment preferred). Please email in advance if you require any other second hand uniform, and new uniform can be ordered through Arbor.

<u>Lunch Menus</u>
New lunch menus can be found <u>here</u> on the school website. Polite reminder that children can either have school dinners or packed lunch every day, or, if they wish, children having packed lunch can opt into school dinners, but they must **only** do this on a Wednesday and/or Friday.

There is expected to be a 'mini heat wave' next week and we would like to ensure parents and children take appropriate precautions. This could mean applying sun-cream before school. Please check that your sucream does not contain almond oil (previously some Nivea products did). Children may consider bringing a cap to school, and GJS ones are available to purchase via Arbor for £6. Finally, children MUST have a water bottle. We will be monitoring temperatures at school too, as we do anyway at this time of year, and this may inform the time children spend outside. With the pollen count rising, we do ask that parents give children a 'once a day' antihistamine to reduce medication being administered at school.
