Another fine example of the children at GJS 'doing their bit' for their community!

<u>School Attendance</u> Continuing our focus on maintaining high levels of attendance at GJS, next week we will be sending out our termly reminder letter to all parents further informing our **community** on our position on attend-ance, offering advice and continuing to request that no holidays are taken during term time as they are all considered unauthorised and parents could incur a penalty notice. We would also like to take this opportunity to remind parents that school registers are taken at **8.35am**, when the gates are closed and it is imperative that children are in their class at this time. Well done to 3EC who are the class with the highest attendance this term since 3rd September with **98**%.

#### 10R-Human Rights Week

This week the children were immersed in all things 'Rights Respecting' as part of Human Rights Week, our 4th 10richment week of the year, and coinciding with World Human Rights Day. There has been an art focus in Year 3 on the various 'articles', year 5 and 6 workshops on smart technology, see below, and Mr Samson shared our UNICEF Rights Respecting journey on Monday in assembly. *Did you know...*there are over 80million children missing out on education around the world!

GJS Carols by Candlelight We are looking forward to our carol events next week. We are asking that only 2 adults attend and we are asking that ALL seats are taken in order for all to see and enjoy. We will be asking parents to enter via the Year 3 external doors each day, ready for a prompt 9.15am start. Upper School SMART Phone Workshops On Tuesday, the Upper School took part in Smartphone workshops with Sammy from PAPAYA. They dis-cussed the advantages and disadvantages of the internet and how companies use persuasive design to make devices more addictive for the user. They also discussed how device use affects mental health and the children were shocked to discover that the average 12-year-old spends around 3 hours and 48 minutes on devices a day, which equates to over 10 years during their lifetime! The children were all very reflective on their own behaviour around the devices they have access to and gave thoughtful con-tributions to discussion. tributions to discussions.

#### Christmas Fair-Tonight 4.30-7.30pm



# **GJS Autumn Sports Summary**

Well done to all the children who have embraced the sporting opportunities on offer at GJS this term, whether taking part in our autumn house event, putting themselves forward in school trials or representing the school at various tournaments.

Broadly dominated by football, GJS entered 6 teams in ALL football tournaments at Tillingbourne this term winning one, being narrowly beaten finalists in another and securing semi-final positions in 2 others.

At the Glebelands Cross Country event we had nearly 30 children represent the school securing medal positions in the Year 4 girls race, the Year 5 boys race and Year 6 girls race.

We also had our Year 4's take part in a Sports Hall Athletics event at Broadwater, introducing them to the specific races. Next term our Year 5/6 children will taking part in their event at Woolmer Hill, trials have been taking place recently to find our team!

As for our house events, we had 167 children from across the school take part in our Chippie Chase way back in September. This equated to 70% of the school!
