### 10R-Science Week

It's been another successful Science Week at GJS!! Our theme has been 'Adapt and Change' and true to form, all the children have fully embraced the theme and shown great enthusiasm. In Year 6, we explored how butterflies have had to adapt and change over time in order to survive. In Year 4, we explored bee communication and applied our understanding of adapt and change to some of their computing work on Scratch! Year 5 linked the theme with their Earth and Space topic and explored how humans would need to adapt and change not just how they lived day to day, but also the rules and laws that they'd need to follow, and in Year 3 we explored animal adaptations and started really unpicking how different animals have changed over time in order to survive. As if that wasn't exciting enough, Year 3 were also very lucky to be visited by Dave Prangley and Adam Drury who are both engineers and came to talk to Year 3 about how they experience science in their jobs!
