10R—Earth Week
For the final 10richment of the term, we have been focusing on all things ECO. It has been great to hear the habitual change, the children are trying out, whether this is having less screen time, turning down thermostats or switching things off from the mains; it is good to hear children being more mindful around what energy is being used. We do ask families to engage in Earth Hour tomorrow and consider what further ways we can be greener in our family to consider that requires energy around the home and consider what further ways we can be greener in our behaviours!

Plastic Recycling Workshop
As part of Earth Week, on Tuesday the Year 5 and 6 School Councillors were invited to Charterhouse for a workshop about recycling plastic. The children used a plastic shredder to break plastic bottles into tiny pieces before using a process called Injection Moulding to produce combs, pens and rings. They worked brilliantly as a team to ensure that the process ran smoothly and safely while trying to create as many items as possible. The children had lots of fun and learnt about what a simple milk bottle could become in the future when it is recycled.

Year 5 River Wey Trip
Yesterday, Year 5 children had a wonderful morning on their River Wey trip. In very pleasant sunshine, we walked along a stretch of the river and took notes on the various human and physical geographical features that are visible there. We also discussed our predictions for what it might look like in 100 years' time. Additionally, the children took the opportunity to put this term's art skills into practice by drawing the landscape across the Lammas Lands.

Year 4 Police Talk
On Tuesday, Year 4 were visited by the Youth Engagement Officers (YEO) from the Police who talked to the children about staying safe. PC Dave and Laura talked about what they do as YEOs, which includes visits to schools, patrolling when schools finish and meeting with other professionals who help keep children safe. The children were shown what a police officer has on their uniform and the tools they use. They even got to touch some of police equipment which included a baton and handcuffs, and they had the opportunity to try on a police vest and hat.

<u>Our 'in focus' Value: TOLERANCE</u>
This half term, we continue our focus on the value of TOLERANCE, when the children will learn the importance of this value, what it 'looks like' at GJS, how we try and engender a culture of this value at school and the dangers of intolerance in society. Once again, any 'home talks' you can have with the children on the value is always much appreciated.
